A new version of the NAACCR edits metafile, NAACCR v13A (version 13A), has been posted (05/31/2013) and can be downloaded from the NAACCR Web Site. An earlier version was posted 05/28/2013. If you downloaded that version, please replace it with the metafile posted today. It contains a correction to the edit "CS SSF 16, MerkelCell Schemas (CS)". A spreadsheet of the changes is attached and also available along with the metafile on the NAACCR website.

Please note the following:

- We will be releasing "edits impact" statements sometime in the next couple weeks. The edit impact statements will provide additional information on new and revised edits that could impact old cases and recommendations on how to resolve these additional edit errors.

PARK HILLS – St. Francois and surrounding county residents will have the opportunity to participate in a historic study that the American Cancer Society says will have the potential to change the face of cancer for future generations.

“Men and women between the ages of 30 and 65 who have never been diagnosed with cancer are needed to participate in the ACS Cancer Prevention Study-3 (CPS-3),” said Steve Weiss, ACS spokesperson. “CPS-3 will enroll a diverse population of 300,000 people across the United States and Puerto Rico. The opportunity for area residents to enroll will be held July 13 at the North College Center on Mineral Area College’s Park Hills campus.”

“CPS-3 will help researchers better understand the lifestyle, environmental, and genetic factors that cause or prevent cancer,” explained Weiss.

Enrollment in the study involves two steps:

- After scheduling an appointment, individuals will be asked to complete a comprehensive survey online that asks for information on lifestyle, behavioral and other factors related to their health.
- Participate in an in-person enrollment process which takes approximately 20–30 minutes and includes measuring waist circumference and collecting a small blood sample from participants. Upon completion of this process, ACS will send periodic follow-up surveys every few years to individuals to update their information and annual newsletters with study updates and results.

REIDSVILLE, N.C. — The Cancer Center at Annie Penn Hospital is providing free skin cancer screenings on Monday, June 24.

The screenings, which are sponsored by the American Academy of Dermatology, will be offered from 5:30 to 7 p.m. in the cancer center located on the hospital’s fourth floor.



The screenings are open to: adults and children who have not seen a dermatologist in the past year and don’t have insurance or are unable to afford to see their regular physician.
