<p>a. New co-chair Colleen shared she is moving to the Health Department Bureau level but will still be in cancer epidemiology. Therefore, she will no longer be registry director and will need to step down as co-chair of S&RD as soon as a replacement is on board.</p>

<p>a. ICD-O-3 WG report – Lois Lois shared the only new 5th Edition classification tumor book reviewed was urinary and male genital tumors. The review identified 36 new or related terms for existing ICD-O codes and 6 new codes primarily <i>insitu</i> germ cell neoplasms. We do not foresee any uptick in cases. These items were presented to MLTG. They will continue to work with Cancer PathChart until it is complete. WHO anticipates publishing 3 more 5th Edition books this year. There is considerable discussion about the reportability of Grade 2 dysplasias.</p>					
<p>b. Edits WG report – Jim V23A edits metafile was released March 17th. A workshop on March 27th took place for central registry edits metafile administrators and had 80 participants. The WG is considering releasing the minor version (e.g., v24a) in May instead of March. Work has begun on the v24 edits metafile and will be released in late August or early September.</p>					
<p>c. Surgery Code Crosswalks – Jim Jim reviewed the crosswalks for 2023 that are posted on the NAACCR website. One compares the old codes to new and the other new codes to old. The task force will now begin work on 2024 surgery codes. Jim addressed a possible complication with consolidation Gary Levin pointed out. The scope of the Surgery Code Task Force is not going to change although at the first meeting they will discuss the consolidation issue Gary brought up. Gary discussed the complexity of rolling updates, things to be aware of and the need for defined rules. He volunteered to be part of this task force.</p>					

<p>d. Override Site/Lat/SeqNo [2110] issue – Recinda Recinda shared a couple slides regarding the excluded cases with override flag during tumor-level deduplication. She shared numbers based on December 2022 CiNA Submission that showed an unequal distribution among registries. Recinda believes RDU can support an effort to follow up on this but cannot take the lead. It was suggested this may be a software issue.</p> <p>e. Board/Chair meeting report – Colleen/Heather Heather updated the group on the meeting attended in Atlanta by all steering committee chairs and the NAACCR Board. The bulk of the conversation focused on the two types of strategic priorities and activities categories: 1) project-focused and 2) capacity building. Each chair/co-chair had to complete a collaborative report template that included action steps around specific strategic initiatives for S&RD. Updates will need to be made to the S&RD workplan.</p> <p>f. Cancer Informatics Advisory Group update – Eric/Gary This group has been working on genomic reporting regarding the current landscape and various reporting standards. It is an important topic NAACCR should look at and CIAG plans to make recommendations. The legalities and benefit(s) to the cancer registry was discussed.</p> <p>g. Mid-Level Tactical Group update – Colleen/Heather The vote was conducted in the last 2 weeks of March, the results have not yet been announced. Heather shared with the group all the items up for a vote. Concerns were shared about the pediatric staging data items. Lori emphasized there has been considerable discussion about these items, the challenges and need for implementation plans. The MLTG vote was provided to the HLSG for their consideration in voting.</p> <p>h.
